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NOTICE TO BIDDERS

1. VERY IMPORTANT NOTICE ON DISQUALIFICATIONS:

A bid not complying with the peremptory requirements stated hereunder will be regarded as not being an "Acceptable bid", and as such will be rejected.

"Acceptable bid" means any bid which, in all respects, complies with the conditions of bid and specifications as set out in the bid documents.

To ensure that your bid is not exposed to invalidation, documents are to be completed in accordance with the conditions and bid rules contained in the bid documents. The lowest or any bid will not necessarily be accepted, and ERWAT reserves the right not to consider any bid not or a bid not comprehensively completed as well as the right to accept a bid in whole or part. ERWAT reserves the right to appoint more than one bid for this contract.

2. A BID WILL BE REJECTED:

- If bidders are not compliant with all applicable legislative requirements, as per CSD. National Treasury in partnership with the Provincial Treasury have developed municipalities and municipal entities with a Central Supplier Database (CSD) for the registration of prospective suppliers in line with Section 14(1) (b) of the Municipal Supply Chain Management Regulations (MSCMR). (Tax compliance will be dealt with in terms of MFMA Circular No. 90)
- Non-compliance with the Value Added Tax Act,1991; i.e. In terms of this Act, it is mandatory for any business to register for VAT if the income earned in any consecutive twelve (12) month period exceeds or is likely to exceed R 1 million. NB: Bidder/s failing to comply with this provision of the Value Added Tax Act, 1991 WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED, therefore rejected.
- Non-compliance with the Municipal Supply Chain Management Regulations, 2005; i.e. All sections
 affecting the evaluation of the bid must be indicated on the bid document and must be submitted and
 completed in full. All bidder's information must be accurate and correct.
- In the event of a failure to complete and sign in full the pricing schedule as required (unless indicated otherwise).
- In the event of there being scratching out, writing over or painting out rates or information, affecting the evaluation of the bid, without the authorised person initialling next to the amended rates or information. However, in cases where the total amount (aggregated) has not been affected, the bid will still be acceptable.
- In the event of the use of correction fluid (e.g., tippex), any erasable ink, or any erasable writing instrument (e.g., pencil). Bid documents to be completed in ink.
- If the Bid has not been properly signed by a person having the authority to do so. (Refer to Declaration).
- Where the recommended bidder is not tax compliant, the bidder should be notified of their non-compliant status and the bidder will be requested to submit to the municipal entity, within 7 working days. The bidder will be rejected if they fail to provide proof of tax compliance status within the 7 working days after recommendation.
- If the bidder attempts to influence or has in fact influenced the evaluation and/or awarding of the contract.
- If the bid has either been submitted in the wrong bid box or after the relevant closing date and time.
- If any municipal rates and taxes or municipal service charges owed by the bidder or any of its directors/members to the municipality or municipal entity, or to any other municipality or municipal

entity, are in arrears for more than three months (unless if the bidder has attached proof of the payment arrangement of the arrears to the bid document as at the closing date of the submission of bids).

- If any bidder who during the last five years has failed to perform satisfactorily on a previous contract with the municipality, municipal entity or any other organ of state after written notice was given to that bidder that performance was unsatisfactory.
- The accounting officer must ensure that irrespective of the procurement process followed, no award may be given to a person –
 - who is in the service of the state, or;
 - if that person is not a natural person, of which any director, manager, shareholder or stakeholder, is a person in the service of the state; or; who is an advisor or consultant contracted with the municipality in respect of contract that would cause a conflict of interest.
- If the bidder is not registered in the required CIDB contractor grading designation (category) or higher, if required in this bid documentation. (only applicable to construction projects)
- If the bidder or any of its directors is listed on the Register of Bid Defaulters in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act of 2004 as a person prohibited from doing business with the public sector.
- If more than one (1) company quotes and the Director/s are the same Person/s and the companies fail to disclose this in the MBD4; the bids will be rejected as a result of Anti-Competitive Behaviour.
- NO BIDS WILL BE CONSIDERED FROM PERSONS IN THE SERVICE OF THE STATE (as defined in Regulation 44 of the Local Government: Municipal Supply Chain Management Regulations).
- If the bidder has failed to submit ALL required documents as specified on the bid document.
- If the following have not been fully completed and signed:
 - MBD 1 General Declaration
 - MBD 3.1 Pricing schedule (firm prices)
 - MBD 4 Declaration of Interest
 - MBD 6.1 Preference points claim form in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2022
 - MBD 7.2 Contract Form: Procurement of Services
 - MBD 8 Declaration of bidder's past supply chain management practices
 - MBD 9 Certificate of Independent Bid Determination
- If any pages have been removed from the bid document, and have therefore not been submitted, or a copy of the original bid document has been submitted (all signatures to be original on each page).
- If the bidder fails to achieve the minimum score in terms of the functionality evaluation.

3. EVALUATION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

All bids will be evaluated in the following three phases:

3.1 Phase I: Initial screening process

In terms of National Treasury Instruction No. 4A of 2016/2017 regarding the National Central Supplier Database (CSD), all bidders must register on the CSD to provide the following information to be verified through the CSD:

- a) Business registration, including details of directorship and membership;
- b) Bank Account holder information;
- c) In the service of the State status;

- d) Identity number;
- e) Tender default and restriction status;
- f) Any additional and supplementary verification information communicated by National Treasury.
- g) An administrative evaluation will be carried out on all the bids received based on the under mentioned documentation:
- h) Proof of company Central Supplier Database Registration (CSD).

The following information will be verified with the returnable schedule:

- a. Submission of a valid SARS pin to validate Tax compliance status;
- b. Valid rates and taxes account not older than 3 months and not in arrears for more than 90 days. The rates and taxes accounts of a bidder as an entity must be in the name of the company. In the event that the bidding entity is renting the premises, a signed valid lease agreement must be submitted. The rates and taxes of a sole proprietor must be in the name of the individual bidder.
- c. Fully completed and signed MBD forms as provided for in the returnable schedule.
- d. In case of Joint Venture, Consortium, Trust, or Partnership a Valid Tax Clearance Certificate and/or SARS issued pin code (which will be verified) for both companies must be submitted.
- e. In case of Joint Venture, Consortium, Trust, or Partnership, a signed teaming agreement must be submitted.

3.2 Phase II: Functionality evaluation as per attached Terms of Reference:

- a) Bids will be evaluated strictly according to the bid evaluation criteria stipulated in the terms of reference.
- b) Bidders must, as part of their bid documents, submit supportive documentation for all technical requirements as indicated hereunder. The panel responsible for scoring the respective bids will evaluate and score all bids based on their submissions and the information provided.
- c) Bidders will not rate themselves but need to ensure that all information is supplied as required. The Bid Evaluation Committee (BEC) will evaluate and score all responsive bids and will verify all documents submitted by the bidders.
- d) The panel members will individually evaluate the responses received against the following criteria as set out below:
 - (i) Evaluation Criteria as stipulated in the tender document
- e) Any proposal not meeting a minimum score on functionality proposal will be disqualified and the financial proposal will not be considered.

3.3 Phase III: Price/Financial stage and Specific goals:

- a) Price/ Financial proposals must be submitted in South African Rand.
- b) Evidence required to claim for specific goals will include, but not limited to CK document, Full CSD report, ID documents of company owners, MKVA force number, Municipal account/ lease agreement and Proof of disability issued by medical doctor. Kindly refer to the MBD 6.1 document for specific goals.
- c) ERWAT reserves the right to verify the documents submitted as evidence.
- d) ERWAT reserves the right to negotiate rates submitted by bidders.

4. <u>LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY FRAMEWORK</u>

This bid and all contracts emanating there from will be subject to the General Conditions of Contract issued in accordance with of the Treasury Regulations 16A published in terms of the Municipal Finance Management Act (ACT 56 OF 2003).

The Special Conditions of Contract are supplementary to that of the General Conditions of Contract. In the event of any contradiction between the GCC or any other applicable contractual agreement, the Municipal Financial Management Act and its applicable regulations will take precedence.

5. JOINT VENTURES, TRUSTS OR CONSORTIUM

A trust, consortium or joint venture, will be able to claim for points for their specific goals provided that the entity submits a valid signed agreement.

The information will be verified in accordance with the bidders B-BBEE certificate, and or a certificate from the companies and intellectual property commission (CIPC), the department of Military Veterans and or other supporting documents. All supporting evidence must be submitted in order to claim the preferential procurement points claimed. ERWAT reserves the right to verify the information submitted.

In the case of multi-parties (Joint ventures, consortiums, partnerships, etc.), allocation of points will be calculated by adding the individual parties in the JV, etc. ownership % together; divide the total by the number of parties in the respective joint ventures, consortiums, partnerships, etc. The average % will thus be the indicating factor for the number of points to be scored limited to the maximum available points.

Bidders must submit concrete proof of the existence of joint ventures and/or consortium arrangements. ERWAT will accept signed agreements as acceptable proof of the existence of a joint venture and/or consortium arrangement.

The joint venture and/or consortium agreements must clearly set out the roles and responsibilities of the Lead Partner and the joint venture and/or consortium party. The agreement must also clearly identify the Lead Partner, with the power of attorney to bind the other party/parties in respect of matters pertaining to the joint venture and/or consortium arrangement.

6. TAX COMPLIANCE STATUS

The designated ERWAT official(s) will verify the tax compliance status prior to the finalisation of the award of the bid or price quotation.

Where the recommended bidder is not tax compliant, the bidder will be notified of their non-compliant status and the bidder will be requested to submit to the municipal entity, within 7 working days, written proof from SARS of their tax compliance status or proof from SARS that they have made an arrangement to meet their outstanding tax obligations.

The proof of tax compliance status submitted by the bidder to the municipal entity will be verified via the CSD or e-Filing. The accounting officer will reject a bid submitted by the bidder if such a bidder fails to provide proof of tax compliance status within the timeframe stated above.

Where a supplier does not submit a tax compliance status PIN but provides a CSD number, ERWAT will utilise the CSD number via its website www.csd.gov.za to access the supplier records and verify tax compliance status. A printed screen view at the time of verification will be attached to the suppliers' records for audit purposes.

Where goods and services are procured from foreign suppliers with tax obligations in South Africa, proof of tax compliance status will be obtained from the supplier.

Foreign suppliers with neither South African tax obligations nor history of doing business in South Africa must complete a pre-award questionnaire on the MBD 1 for their tax obligation categorisation. Where a recommendation for award of a bid has been made to a bidder who is a foreign supplier and who completed the pre-award questionnaire on the MBD 1, ERWAT will submit a copy of the completed MBD 1 received from the bidder to SARS on the following email address:

<u>GovernmentInstitute@sars.gov.za</u>. SARS will issue a letter to the procuring entity confirming whether or not the foreign supplier has tax obligations in South Africa.

Where goods and services are procured from foreign suppliers with no tax obligation in South Africa, there is no need to request proof of tax compliance status.

Where goods and services are imported, all custom related taxes shall be applied as prescribed by SARS.

7. VALUE ADDED TAX

All bid prices must be inclusive of 15% Value-Added Tax where applicable.

8. CLIENT BASE

ERWAT reserves the right to contact references during the evaluation and adjudication process to obtain information. In the event that a bidder is found to have submitted falsified documents during the bid evaluation/award phase the bidder will be disqualified and will not be considered for any further tenders submitted.

9. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Successful service providers will enter into a service level agreement with ERWAT. In the event that the provisions contradict each other between the tender document and service level agreement, the tender document will take precedence.

10. COMMUNICATION

ERWAT may communicate with bidders for, among others, where bid clarity is sought, to obtain information or to extend the validity period. Any communication either by facsimile, letter or electronic mail or any other form of correspondence to any ERWAT official, department or representative of a testing institution or a person acting in an advisory capacity for ERWAT in respect of this bid, between the closing date and the award of the bid by the bidder is strictly prohibited.

11. ATTENDANCE OF ERWAT BRIEFING SESSIONS

Bidders must take note of the provisions for site/briefing sessions as advertised in the media, ERWAT website and or on the e-tender portal.

In the event that a compulsory briefing session will be conducted, bidders must attend the session either on site or via zoom platform as indicated in the bid document and advertisement. Bidders will be given a link on the advert and tender document to register prior to the briefing session. On the day of the briefing session, bidders must log onto the link to attend. The zoom platform keeps record of bidders registered and in attendance.

Documents will only be accepted from bidders whose names appear on the attendance register. Failure to attend the compulsory briefing sessions whose names do not appear on the register, will render the bidder's submission invalid and will not be considered for evaluation.

Kindly note that the company representative that attends this session will be accepted as a person with the relevant technical expertise applicable to this bid.

Bidders are encouraged to collect bidding documents before the briefing session to allow them sufficient time to peruse the scope so that any queries can be dealt with at the briefing session. Bidders will be allowed 10 days from the date of the compulsory briefing session to direct further queries to the SCM department per e-mail. An addendum will be sent to the attending bidders with clarity on questions raised during these 10 days. A copy of the minutes and attendance register will be attached thereto for ease reference.

12. ELECTRONIC SUBMISSIONS:

- Bidders may submit tenders in electronic format; however, such bids must be supplemented by sealed hard copies and deposited in the tender box on the date and time as indicated in the tender document.
- Failure to submit in the tender boxes will render your bid non-responsive and will be disqualified.
- Each bidder will receive a link to upload files to the folder via a system generated email.
- Kindly note that only bidders who attended the compulsory briefing session will receive a link to Share Point (SP) platform.

- Bidder to click the upload link within the email and will be prompted to upload the files pertaining to the respective bid.
- Bidders must complete the section provided with a name and surname.
- Bidders must click "submit" to upload documents and will be notified on screen of the successful
 upload.
- ERWAT will receive an e-mail notification of each upload received for the respective bid from the bidders.
- Bidders will only be allowed to upload their document once. Kindly ensure that it is the final signed document and that all its' returnable and supporting documents are attached and uploaded before submitting. There will be no second link available.
- Closing time for electronic submissions is 12:00 am the night before the official bid closing date and opening as set out in the advertisement.
- Any documents uploaded after the closing date and time of the official bid opening session, will
 not be accepted and will be disqualified.
- Bidders should note that SharePoint has an audit trail.
- In the event that bidders are required to submit samples, it is advised that they submit the bid document electronically as well as in the tender boxes and attend the opening session to hand over the samples.
- B. Kindly note that the signed hard copy submitted in the tender box, will take precedence for evaluation purposes. The electronic copy is for back-up purposes only.

Bidders should note that if there are discrepancies between the original bid document submitted in the tender box and the electronic copy, the original bid document will take precedence.

The tender boxes will be opened first and recorded in the tender register on the date and time stipulated in the advertisement and or bid documents. The Supply Chain Staff will record the responses in the opening register in the presence of the public in attendance, the user department and security staff.

ERWAT will access electronic submissions received after the official bid opening session and a copy of the electronic submission trail will be attached to the relevant bidder's response received for audit trail.

13. LATE BIDS

Bids received at the address indicated in the bid documents, after the closing date and time, will not be accepted for consideration and where applicable, be returned unopened to the bidder.

14. COUNTER CONDITIONS

Bidders' attention is drawn to the fact that amendments to any of the Special Conditions by bidders will result in such bids being disqualified.

15. PROHIBITION OF RESTRICTIVE PRACTICES

- a) In terms of section 4(1) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder(s) is/ are or a contractor(s) was/were involved in:
 - directly or indirectly fixing a purchase or selling price or any other trading condition;
 - dividing markets by allocating customers, suppliers, territories or specific types of goods or services; or
 - collusive bidding.
- b) If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), in the judgment of the purchaser, has/have engaged in any of the restrictive practices referred to above, the purchaser may, without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered or terminate the contract in whole or in

part and refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998.

16. FRONTING

ERWAT supports the spirit of broad based black economic empowerment and recognizes that real empowerment can only be achieved through individuals and businesses conducting themselves in accordance with the Constitution and in an honest, fair, equitable, transparent and legally compliant manner. Against this background ERWAT condemns any form of fronting.

ERWAT, in ensuring that bidders conduct themselves in an honest manner will, as part of the bid evaluation processes, conduct or initiate the necessary enquiries/investigations to determine the accuracy of the representation made in bid documents. Should any of the fronting indicators as contained in the Guidelines on Complex Structures and Transactions and Fronting issued by the Department of Trade and Industry, established during such enquiry/investigation, the onus will be on the bidder contractor to prove that fronting does not exist. - Habitat evaluations must take place using the Invertebrate Habitat Assessment System (IHAS) according to the protocol of McMillan. 1998.
- All relevant scores such as SASS, IHAS, FHAI, FCII, ASPT etc. must be recorded.
- Additional aspects to be recorded and assessed include:
 - o Biota specific water quality including pH,
 - Electrical conductivity (mS/m).
 - Dissolved oxygen (mg/l) and
 - Temperature in °C
 - Diatom Community Assessment
 - Bio-toxicity testing
- A photographic record and visual assessment of each site must be made;
- Data analyses must take place and comparisons must be made on both spatial and temporal scale;
- Reporting must consider that SASS total scores recorded downstream of discharge point
 may not be more than 20% less than that of the upstream point, and the average score per

4.3 Bio-toxicity testing

Toxicity testing is required on water samples taken from the final effluent from each WCWs. The biological tests that are required in the acute toxicity evaluation include the following:

- Water flea (Daphnia pulex) 48h lethality test
- Guppy (*Poecilia reticulata*) 96h lethality test

These toxicity tests need to be performed by a SANAS accredited laboratory and relevant SANAS certificates need to be provided.

4.4 **Monitoring Points**

The locations of the monitoring points for the bio-monitoring programme were pre-selected based on the below criteria. Alternative sites to be investigated once the existing points become unsuitable/inaccessible, by the service provider and to advise ERWAT in this regard. When no alternative point can be located, service provider to advise ERWAT on any other methods/assessments that can be made to supplement the monitoring of the river, including meetings with the DWS to obtain permission to deviate from the prescribed methods as per the Water Use License conditions.

- The location of the sites in relation to the WCW with special mention of the effluent discharge point;
- An attempt to ensure points were located as close as possible to the works was made to
 prevent impacts from exterior influences such as nearby industrial areas and sewage spills
 from failing municipal infrastructure, and it should be noted as such in any report and
 conclusion made;
- Suitable habitat for sampling with special mention of rocky substrate, marginal vegetation and a depth profile that is conducive to sampling;
- Accessibility with a vehicle to transport equipment; and,
- Safety considerations.
 - ERWAT reserves the right to add or reduce the number of sites as may be required in terms of Water Use License conditions and changing legislation, and
 - o Move the monitoring point, when required, due to site conditions, and after consultation with the service provider.

4.5 <u>Background Information on Monitoring Points</u>

DRAINAGE DISTRICT 3

Esther Park

a. Upstream

The upstream point ESP-U is located within the Modderfontein Industrial Complex, where a narrow channel flows past the WCW. The site receives water from under the R25 through a subterranean channel, which feeds into the narrow run before entering another subterranean channel after the confluence with the final effluent. Water levels at this site remain low, with water clarity recorded at 19 cm.

b. Downstream

The downstream monitoring point ESP-D is located downstream of the Modderfontein Industrial Complex. The site receives water through the culvert running under Centenary Road. The site is comprised of a narrow run connecting several small pools. The water clarity was recorded at 19 cm during the survey.

Benoni

a. Upstream

The drainage system point consists only of wetland habitat and no existing channelled streams in place.

b. Downstream

Site BEN-D is located along the banks of the Amata Pan. A clearing within dense wall of reeds surrounding the inundated pan allowed for access to open water along Dagenham Road. The site remains unconducive for aquatic bio-monitoring, therefore only diatom and chemical analysis samples were collected.

Hartebeestfontein

a. Upstream

The upstream point, HBF-U, is located at a bridge crossing along the R25. The site is frequently used for various cultural practices, waste dumping and water extraction. Water levels and flow rate had increased in relation to previous surveys, as a result of the recent rainfall experienced throughout the region during the time of the survey. Water clarity was recorded at 26 cm during the November 2019 survey.

b. Downstream

The downstream site is located approximately 4 km downstream from the final effluent release, at a bridge crossing on 50th Road. Recent rainfall throughout the region had resulted in elevated water levels and increased flow during the time of the survey, with water clarity recorded at 26 cm.

Olifantsfontein

a. Upstream

The upstream point, OLF-U, is accessed from a dirt road off of South View Road. The land surrounding the site is utilised for small scale agricultural practices and illegal dumping resulting in a large amount of waste within the aquatic environment. Over the course of the surveys, the site has continuously deteriorated due to increasing amounts of refuse dumped into the system, and a recent net had been installed under the bridge in an attempt to trap waste, however, the net had failed as a result of localised flooding of the system.

b. Downstream

The downstream site, OLF-D, is located near a bridge crossing on Glen Road. The site is comprised of a rock dominated run connecting two deep pooled areas. The site had recently experienced flooding, as a result of the rainfall throughout the region, which had also carried additional refuse along the banks of the site. Water levels and flow were elevated during the time of the survey, with a large amount of fine silt within the water resulting in a clarity value of 6 cm.

Rynfield

a. Upstream

The upstream site, RYN-U, is located along the banks of the Van Ryn Dam. There is no riverine surface water habitat available for the application of the SASS 5 and IHAS.

b. Downstream

The downstream point, RYN-D, receives water from the outflow of Van Ryn Dam which flows into smaller pools interconnected by a narrow channel. The area remains utilised for informal disposal of rubble, agricultural waste and refuse. The water levels at the site had increased following recent rainfall throughout the region, and the water clarity recorded at 15 cm.

DRAINAGE DISTRICT 4

Ancor

a. Upstream

A new alternative location was used for monitoring point ANC-U, situated downstream of the pump station. The site is comprised of a narrow, shallow channel which is fed from the upstream dam and disappears into the bed of reed downstream. Water clarity was recorded at 78 cm during the survey. This is the first round of bio-monitoring conducted at the upstream monitoring point.

b. Downstream

The downstream site, ANC-D, is comprised of a channel, flowing alongside two small farm dams. The site remains inundated with discoloured black water and decaying vegetation throughout the site. Water levels had increased during the time of the survey, and water

clarity was recorded at 9 cm.

Daveyton

a. Upstream

Monitoring point DAV-U is located downstream of a dam, which feeds water into a wetland with multiple pools. The site is unfavourable for aquatic bio-monitoring as it is a wetland comprised of multiple pools.

b. Downstream

The downstream site, DAV-D, is located within a farm and comprised of a small channel located along the N12 highway, approximately 3 km downstream of the final effluent release. The site is comprised of a short run into a pool prior to flowing underneath the highway. The vegetation at the site had recovered and grown significantly in relation to the previous survey which might from time to time pose a challenge. Water clarity was recorded at 76 cm during the time of the survey conducted during November 2019.

Jan Smuts

a. Upstream

The upstream site, JS-U, is located immediately upstream of the Jan Smuts Dam. The site is comprised of a concreted channel which feeds into a small pool flowing into the Jan Smuts Dam. The water flowing into the site was discoloured brown. The hyacinth population remains prevalent at the site, with an increasing amount of refuse at the site present.

b. Downstream

The downstream site, JS-D, is located at the spillway of the Jan Smuts Dam. The water spills into an underground culvert. A large portion of the hyacinth population had cleared up, making for a large portion of the surface of the Jan Smuts Dam visible during the time of the survey. The water visible at the sampling point remains black as previously noted.

JP Marais

a. Upstream

The upstream point runs parallel to the N12 towards the culvert underneath Putfontein Road. The site is located along an area of land currently under development. The site is comprised of a narrow run over a GSM dominated bed, feeding into a downstream pool. The flow rate and water levels were low during the time of the survey, and the water was opaque with a clarity value of 13 cm.

b. Downstream

The survey site is located downstream of the railway crossing close to the JPM WCW. The raw sewage previously noted had been cleared up. The site is comprised of a densely vegetated run feeding into a pooled region further downstream. Water levels were elevated during the time of the survey, and water clarity was recorded at 38 cm.

Welgedacht

a. Upstream

Upstream point, WEL-U, is located at a culvert within a wetland upstream of the WCW. No defined channel exists at this site, and very little to no-flow exists within the reed dominated wetland area. Several decomposing animal carcasses were present within the water during

the time of the survey.

b. Downstream

The downstream monitoring point, WEL-D, is comprised of a deep upstream pool that flows over the low-level drift into two narrow stone dominated runs, feeding into a wide sand dominated channel downstream. Water levels and flow had increased during the time of the survey, as a result of recent rainfall within the region. Water clarity was recorded at 54 cm during the survey.

DRAINAGE DISTRICT 5

Carl Grundlingh

a. Upstream

The upstream point, CGRU-U is located near a culvert where water flows into a channelled wetland. The water level of the pool had further decreased in relation to previous surveys, with no evident flow entering the site.

b. Downstrea

c. m

The downstream point, CGRU-D, is located within a wetland along Fred Wegner road at a culvert where water flows towards the Nigel Dam. The site remains non-conducive for aquatic biomonitoring, due to the low water levels and wetland nature of the site.

Heidelberg

a. Upstream

The upstream site HDB-U is located along a dirt road north of the Heidelberg water care works. The site is comprised of a run over a stone dominated bed, with variable depths throughout the surveyed stretch of river. Both water levels and flow rate had increased in relation to the previous survey, and a high amount of suspended silt was observed within the water column and a water clarity value of 11 cm was recorded.

b. Downstream

The downstream point, HDB-D is located alongside the northern portion of the Ratanda Township. The site is comprised of a stone dominated run, with several scattered pooled regions along the banks. A large amount of debris and refuse is scattered along the banks and instream at the site. Water levels and flow rate had increased in relation to the previous survey, and water was discoloured brown due to the suspended fine particles, resulting in a clarity recording of 11 cm.

Herbert Bickley

a. Upstream

The upstream site, HBIC-U, is located south of Noycedale at a bridge crossing the Blesbokspruit. The site is comprised of a long stone dominated run, with a sand dominated meander and a rubble bed further downstream. Both the water levels and flow rate had increased in relation to the previous survey, and the water clarity was recorded at 37 cm.

b. Downstream

The downstream site is located approximately 4 km downstream at a bridge crossing over the Blesbokspruit south of Jameson Park. The site is comprised of a boulder dominated run, with a dense bed of aquatic vegetation established on the boulders and terminates in a pool underneath the bridge. Both the water levels and flow rate were elevated during the time of the survey, with a water clarity value recorded at 68 cm.

Ratanda

a. Upstream

The upstream site, RAT-U, is located immediately upstream of the Ratanda WCW. The water was visibly discoloured brown, and the water levels at the site had increased, creating non-conducive conditions for aquatic bio-monitoring.

b. Downstream

The downstream point, RAT-D, is located near a farm bridge crossing the Blesbokspruit. The water depth and steep banks of the site create non-conducive conditions for aquatic bio-monitoring. The water was observed as being discoloured brown during the time of the survey.

Tsakane

a. Upstream

The upstream point, TSA-U, is located immediately outside of the water care works and receives water passing through the Tsakane township and numerous drainage channels. The site remains as a potential health hazard, due to the persistent presence of raw, untreated waste flowing throughout the site. Aquatic bio-monitoring was not performed due to potential health risks.

b. Downstream

The downstream monitoring point, TSA-D, is located immediately south of the water care works. The site remains unsanitary, due to the persistent contamination of untreated solid organic waste evident throughout the site.

DRAINAGE DISTRICT 6

Dekema

a. Upstream

The upstream site, DEK-U, is located at a bridge crossing along Masakhane Street. The site is comprised of a narrow shallow run between deeply eroded banks, with a single deep pool. Water present at this site remains discoloured as an opaque brown, with a browngrey sludge present throughout the site. Water levels at the site increased slightly in relation to the previous survey, and water clarity was recorded as 49 cm.

b. Downstream

The Dekema downstream monitoring point is shared with Vlakplaats WCW as their upstream monitoring point. The monitoring point is located at an old weir within the Natalspruit, which is frequently utilised for various cultural rituals. The site is comprised of a deep pooled area upstream of the collapsed weir, feeding into two channels, one stone and the other GSM dominated. Water levels had increased in relation to the previous survey, with water clarity recorded at 51 cm.

Rondebult

a. Upstream

The upstream point, RON-U, is located on Heidelberg Road and is comprised of a deep upstream pool flowing into a shallow, bedrock and stone dominated run. All submerged surfaces were coated in a layer of fine silt and algae during the time of the survey. The water was discoloured lime green during the survey, and water levels were slightly raised in relation to the previous survey, with water clarity recorded at 72 cm during the survey.

b. Downstream

The downstream site, RON-D, is located under a bridge of Nederveen Highway with a wetland with a defined channel. The site remains unsuitable for aquatic bio-monitoring due to the limited access of the site, and the depth of the channel, therefore only *in-situ* analysis was performed and both chemical analysis and diatom samples were collected.

Vlakplaats

a. Upstream

The Vlakplaats upstream monitoring point is shared with Dekema WCW as their downstream monitoring point. The monitoring point is located at an old weir within the Natalspruit, which is frequently utilised for various cultural rituals. The site is comprised of a deep pooled area upstream of the collapsed weir, feeding into two channels, one stone and the other GSM dominated. Water levels had increased in relation to the previous survey, with water clarity recorded at 51 cm.

b. Downstream

Sampling was performed at the original sampling site, located at the southernmost corner of the WCW area. The site is comprised of a run over a gravel dominated bed, being fed from a deep upstream pool. A small, isolated side channel exists along the upstream portion of the site, with heavily reduced flow in relation to the main channel. Water levels at the site had increased in relation to the previous survey, whereas the flow rate had decreased, and the water clarity at the site was recorded at 57 cm.

Waterval

a. Upstream

The upstream point WAT-U is located alongside a farm adjacent to the WCW. The water at this point is fast and deep.

b. Downstream

The downstream impact site, WAT-D, is located downstream of the WCW before the Rietspruit enters the Klip River. The site remains inaccessible due to the water depth creating conditions unconducive for aquatic bio-monitoring. No discharge was being released by the emergency spillway during the time of the survey.

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GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. **Definitions**

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7 "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the goods are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the

supplier or his subservice providers) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the goods covered by the bid will be manufactured.

- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price, which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25 "Supplier" means the successful bidder who is awarded the contract to maintain and administer the required and specified service(s) to the State.
- 1.26 "Tort" means in breach of contract.
- 1.27 "Turnkey" means a procurement process where one service provider assumes total responsibility for all aspects of the project and delivers the full end product / service required by the contract.
- 1.28 "Written" or "in writing" means hand-written in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services (excluding professional services related to the building and construction industry), sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific goods, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.

3.2 Invitations to bid are usually published in locally distributed news media and on the municipality/municipal entity website.

4. Standards

4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. Use of contract documents and information inspection

- 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent Rights

- 6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.
- 6.2 When a supplier developed documentation / projects for the municipality/ municipal entity, the intellectual, copy and patent rights or ownership of such documents or projects will vest in the municipality / municipal entity.

7. <u>Performance security</u>

- 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents. Another form of acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - b) a cashiers' or certified cheque.
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified.

8. <u>Inspections, tests and analyses</u>

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that goods to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage be subject to inspections, tests and analyses, the bidder or service provider's premises shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the purchaser or organization acting on behalf of the purchaser.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the goods to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the goods or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such goods or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defraved by the supplier.
- 8.6 Goods and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be ejected.
- 8.7 Any contract goods may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analysed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected goods shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with goods, which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal, the rejected goods shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute goods forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected goods, purchase such goods as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- 8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 22 of GCC.

9. Packing

- 9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. <u>Delivery and documents</u>

10.1 Delivery of the goods and arrangements for shipping and clearance obligations, shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract.

11. Insurance

11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified.

12. <u>Transportation</u>

12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified.

13. Incidental Services

- 13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any:
 - (a) Performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) Furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - (c) Furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
 - (d) Performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
 - (e) Training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.
- 13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

- 14.1 As specified, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:
 - (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and:
 - (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

- 15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract is new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise.

- 15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

16. Payment

- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified.
- 16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfilment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated.

17. Prices

17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. Variation Orders

In cases where the estimated value of the envisaged changes in purchase does not vary more than 15% of the total value of the original contract, the service provider may be instructed to deliver the goods—or render the services as such. In cases of measurable quantities, the service provider may be approached to reduce the unit price, and such offers may be accepted provided that there is no escalation in price

19. Assignment

19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. Subcontracts

20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contract if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21. Delays in the supplier's performance

- 21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with

- or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the goods are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
- 21.4 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 22.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.5 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a goods contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase goods of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. <u>Termination for default</u>

- 23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
 - (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2:
 - (a) if the supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
 - (c) if the supplier, in the judgement of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner, as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the supplier as having no objection and proceed with the restriction.

- 23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the purchaser will, at the discretion of the purchaser, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the purchaser actively associated.
- 23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:
 - (i) the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
 - (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
 - (iii) the period of restriction; and
 - (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7 If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or anti-dumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the supplier to the purchaser or the purchaser may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the supplier in regard to goods or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him.

25. Force Majeure

- 25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.
- 25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. Termination for insolvency

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy, which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. Settlement of Disputes

- 27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
- 27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.
- 27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.
- 27.4 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,
 - (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
 - (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier for goods delivered and / or services rendered according to the prescripts of the contract.

28. Limitation of Liability

- 28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or wilful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6
 - (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and
 - (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29. Governing language

29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30. Applicable law

30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified.

31. Notices

- 31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice.
- 31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. Taxes and duties

32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.

- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid SARS must have certified that the tax matters of the preferred bidder are in order.
- 32.4 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose municipal rates and taxes and municipal services charges are in arrears.

33. <u>Transfer of contracts</u>

33.1 The service provider shall not abandon, transfer, cede assign or sublet a contract or part thereof without the written permission of the purchaser.

34. Amendment of contracts

34.1 No agreement to amend or vary a contract or order or the conditions, stipulations or provisions thereof shall be valid and of any force unless such agreement to amend or vary is entered into in writing and signed by the contracting parties. Any waiver of the requirement that the agreement to amend or vary shall be in writing, shall also be in writing.

35. Prohibition of restrictive practices

- 35.1 In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder(s) is / are or a service provider(s) was / were involved in collusive bidding.
- 35.2 If a bidder(s) or service provider(s) based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in section 59 of the Competition Act No 89 0f 1998.
- 35.3 If a bidder(s) or service provider(s) has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or service provider(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or service provider(s) concerned.

- 2.2.4 Where any term is defined within a particular clause, other than the interpretation clause, that term shall bear the meaning ascribed to it in that clause wherever it is used in this Agreement.
- 2.2.5 When any number of days is prescribed, such shall be reckoned exclusively of the first and inclusively of the last day, unless the last day falls on a Saturday, Sunday or Public Holiday, in which case the last day shall be the next succeeding day which is a business day.

3. CONFIRMATION OF DATES

- 3.1 In this Agreement, each of the dates and durations specified hereunder shall refer to the days and months respectively allocated to in the following:
- 3.1.1 "Commencement Date" shall refer to the date of the last signatory on the Service Level Agreement.
- 3.1.2 "Start date" shall refer to the date on which the "Purchase Order" is issued to the SERVICE PROVIDER.

4. APPOINTMENT OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER

- 4.1 ERWAT hereby appoints the SERVICE PROVIDER who, with the signing of this Agreement at the end hereof, accepts such appointment to provide the Services outlined, subject to the terms and conditions set out herein.
- 4.2 All rights and obligations arising from this Agreement shall be deemed to have come into operation on the Commencement Date.
- 4.3 Neither the appointment of THE SERVICE PROVIDER in clause 4.1 nor anything in this Agreement shall give rise to or be construed as giving rise to an employer/employee relationship between the parties, nor shall it give rise to a joint venture nor an agreement of partnership between the parties, nor shall it give rise to a labour broking agreement.
- 4.4 The parties acknowledge that neither of the parties has any authority whatsoever to represent or to bind the other party in any capacity whatsoever. In particular, but without limiting the generality, neither of the parties shall be entitled to conclude any Agreement or sign any document on behalf of the other party, or in any way bind the other party's performance or discharge of any obligation.
- 4.5 The parties agree that no staff member of ERWAT may be requested or solicited to accept any reward gift or favour, nor may any staff member of ERWAT accept any reward gift or favour, for persuading

the municipal council or any structure or functionary of the council with regard to the exercise of any power or the performance of any duty; or to make a representation to the council or any structure or functionary; or to disclose any privileged or confidential information; or to do or not to do anything within that staff member's powers or duties.

4.6 The conduct described under sub-clause 4.5 goes to the root of the Agreement and constitutes a breach of this Agreement with the further proviso that any person found guilty of such conduct shall be dealt with in terms of the provisions of South African Law.

5. COMMENCEMENT AND TERM OF THE AGREEMENT

- 5.1 The Agreement shall endure for the entire Period of Performance.
- 5.2 The contract will commence on the last signature date of the Service Level Agreement.
- 5.3 The appointment is for a Maximum period of thirty-six (36) months limited to three (3) financial periods as determined by the Municipal Finance Management Act (MFMA), on an as and when required basis.
- 5.4 The award is subject to a probation period of Twelve (12) months, whereby if your performance is not to the satisfaction of ERWAT, the contract will automatically lapse after the Twelve (12) months' probation. The contract will thus continue after the 12th month performance evaluation session if deemed to be to the satisfaction of ERWAT as indicated in the performance evaluation document.
- 5.5 If the tender is found to be unauthorised, fruitless and wasteful or irregular as informed through a formal investigation, internal and or external audit outcome, ERWAT reserves the right to cancel the tender with immediate effect and the bidder will have no claim to this effect whatsoever. The final terms of payment (where applicable) will be negotiated with the bidder at the time for final close out of the contract.

6. CONTRACT PRICE

- 6.1 The price charged by the SERVICE PROVIDER for Service performed under this Agreement shall be as per the prices quoted by the SERVICE PROVIDER in their Bid Document.
- The Bid of the SERVICE PROVIDER was awarded and accepted at the agreed rates as outlined in the bill of quantities (as attached herewith under **Annexure C**).
- The fees charged in this bid, will be firm for a period of twelve (12) months, thereafter annual price increases will be affected as per the pricing in the pricing schedule for year 2 and year 3 respectively, unless the contract is terminated prior to such.

7. INDEMNIFICATION

- 7.1. Indemnification is applicable to this tender as set out below:
 - (1) The Contractor hereby agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend ERWAT and their officers, employees, agents and representatives, from and against the following liabilities arising as a result of the execution of the work:
 - (1.1) Any liability with regard to claims by governmental authorities or others for non-compliance by Contractor of any Act of Parliament, law, ordinance, regulation or by-law made by a lawful authority provided that such compliance therewith was required for the execution of the Contract or at Law.
 - (1.2) Any liability arising from actual or alleged public or private nuisance arising out of negligent acts or omissions to act of Contractor or its Subcontractors, or of their employees.
 - (1.3) Any liability arising from loss or damage to Contractor and/or Subcontractor's equipment and their other property on site.
 - (1.4) Any liability arising from claims with regard to the death of/or injury or sickness or disease to Contractor' employees or the death of/or injury or sickness or disease to third parties.

- (1.5) Any liability arising from any loss of/or damage to property belonging to a third party.
- (1.6) Any liability arising from actual or asserted infringement or improper appropriation or use of patents, copyrights, proprietary information or know- how in respect of the work designed by/or under the responsibility of the Contractor.
- (1.7) Any liability arising from the death or injury or loss or damage to property of third parties or ERWAT's property as a result of the negligent acts or omissions of contractors or its subcontractor's employees.
- (1.8) Contractor shall indemnify ERWAT against all claims, proceedings, damages and costs of whatsoever nature arising out of contravention of environmental legislation.

8. TERMS OF REFERENCE AND BID DOCUMENTS

Where possible the stipulations in the Terms of Reference and Bid Document must be interpreted in such a way that it is not in conflict with this Agreement.

However, where any terms, conditions, prescription or guidelines in the Terms of Reference are in direct conflict with this Service Level Agreement and cannot be given a meaning or meanings that are not in conflict with the Agreement, and cannot be reconciled with it, then the Service Level Agreement shall prevail, and where the Service level agreement and Bid document is silent the General Conditions of Contract (GCC, July 2010) shall prevail.

9. PAYMENTS

Standard payment terms are 30 Days from receipt of valid invoice/tax invoice and statement.

ERWAT will not accept any responsibility for the payment of any invoices submitted by a successful bidder(s) if the relevant invoice does not reflect an official ERWAT order number.

All invoices/tax invoices and statements must comply with the **VAT Act No 89 of 1991** before payment can be affected. Any penalties incurred by ERWAT from SARS in relation to any VAT issues in connection with the invoice will be for the account of the service provider.

10. SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PROJECT

- 10.1. If the service provider is given an order to supply ERWAT with any the service and/or product/s, ERWAT reserves the right to have free access to the manufacturing premises in order to perform investigation tests, inspect the product, processes and materials used. Where the service provider is a third party (i.e. is an agent of the manufacturer), ERWAT reserves the right to inspect their warehousing of the material.
- 10.2. If such an inspection reveals unsatisfactory conditions, ERWAT shall temporarily stop further delivery, and if the unsatisfactory conditions cannot be resolved, ERWAT will take steps to terminate the contract. Any additional work that needs to be done to bring the product to the required standard will be for the supplier's account.
- 10.3. Service provider should also provide environmentally friendly solutions, preferably in compliance, occupational health and safety act and all other legislative provisions.
- 10.4 The following legislative provisions (but not limited to) must be adhered to throughout the contract period. These requirement will be applicable on items to be supplied and the will form part of the service level agreement and is not part of the evaluation criteria.

11. RESPONSE TIME

11.1 Standard order turn-around time of shall not exceed 48 hours from placing an order.

12. PENALTIES

- 12.1. Clause 22 "Penalties" of the General Conditions of Contract (GCC, July 2010), refers and will be applicable to this Agreement and read in its entirety.
- 12.2. Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

13. PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

- 13.1. The Performance management system will be implemented in terms of section 3.6 of the bid document.
- 13.2. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall be subjected to a performance evaluation, conducted on a quarterly basis.
- 13.3. An example of a performance evaluation form is contained in **Annexure E**.

14. SITE LOCATION

The services will be conducted at ERWAT's Scientific Services, unless stated otherwise and agreed upon with the bidder.

15. WORKING HOURS

- 16.2. Any damage to an existing service must be reported to ERWAT immediately and reasons and circumstances for the damage must be submitted in writing.
- 16.3. The arrangement to have the damage repaired must immediately be implemented. The damages to be repaired within a day, should this be not possible, at least a mitigation plan must be implemented as a temporary measure until the damages can be permanently resolved. Damages that occur, which is not the SERVICE PROVIDERS fault, must be motivated by the SERVICE PROVIDER for a ruling by ERWAT.

- 22.1. No party's partial exercise of, or failure to exercise or delay in exercising any right, power, privilege or remedy in terms of this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver by that party.
- 22.2.
